ILU Minutes - April 16, 2008

- 1. March minutes accepted with minor change correction to typo
 - a. Elena will correct and send to Julie for uploading to ILU website

2. Announcements:

- a. The Subcommittee meeting regarding TA training has been cancelled. To be rescheduled
- 3. 15-minutes of Library Instruction:
 - a. Roma Kail discussed library instruction at Victoria College, EJ Pratt Library, Readers' Service Librarians' work:
 - i. Have use of an electronic classroom that serves 20
 - ii. They also go into classrooms and offer training
 - iii. Sessions range from 45 minutes 2 hours; average of 20 students in attendance
 - iv. Do training for undergrads in humanities programs
 - v. They do a lot of introductory sessions; building research skills, evaluation of resources, etc., but have noticed an increase in specialized, customized sessions. Also increased requests for one-on-one sessions
 - vi. The one-on-one sessions are often for grads who require help with special collections or RefWorks
 - vii. Have made use of SAILS for learning outcomes
 - viii. Examples of specialized classes: 1. offered by Lisa Sherlock who collaborated with faculty for an assignment requiring students to find primary resources on a public figure; 2. Literary AfterLives a specialized assignment that required students to trace the reputation of a poet, before and after death.
 - b. Elena Prigoda discussed library instruction at Gerstein library:
 - i. Elena provided a handout that summarized the training programs that they offer; much of the training is coordinated through SCIE (Health Sciences Information Consortium of Toronto, Steering Committee for Informatics Education) done – ½ U of T, ½ hospital librarians
 - ii. Noted that they do much less generic training, though students still require general help for RefWorks
 - iii. They use a 'by request' model, usually tied in with a particular assignment

- iv. Have found that their lectures in class have led to one-on-one consults on research questions.
- v. Service undergrad medical program through to those in clinical programs who require fast, distilled info.
- vi. Has submitted a proposal to undergraduate faculty council to offer a training program in class
- c. General discussion regarding increasing teaching opportunities with faculty:
 - Contact faculty if notice large # of students coming into the library regarding the same assignment
 - ii. When offer a session, ask faculty to tell colleagues of the service
 - iii. Have office hours in building
