<u>ILU liaison with Professional Development Committee</u> - nothing to report yet. There will be a Professional Development/ILU event on Blackboard on March 28.

<u>ILU at OISE</u> – Julie presented the online Virtual Library course modules including MEEBO buttons, catalogue instruction, etc. including videos, they are using a new registration system

<u>Blackboard Work Folders</u> – Ryan from RCAT along with Rita showed a method for more efficient maintenance of library content which allows the whole Blackboard community to view content to see whether other librarians have created Blackboard courses.

<u>ILU site</u> - Julie gave a brief overview of (a) locating the ILU web site on the UTL web pages, and (b) review of the contents of the web page. A number of suggestions were made re reorganization of the web page, pages that require updating, and desirable new additions, including (but not limited to):

- revisions to the contact list (incl. adding e-mail addresses)

- begin a collection of evaluation forms, ditto assessments (proposed)

<u>WebCT-based Course in Basic Library Skills</u> - Sarah presented an overview of a project initiated at Carleton University,

consisting of a WebCT-based course in basic library skills. as part of a 'scaffolded research project' in a large undergraduate class.

It was suggested that ITDF funding should be sought to produce a similar product for University of Toronto Libraries, something generic, and which could be modified by individual libraries. The IDTF proposal deadline is March 31st; IDTF provides only 50% of the funding. Project should include someone from each of the 3 campuses.
